This second case of a special two-part series with Dr. Arco Paul and DPT student Kristen Hammack focuses on practical application of High Intensity Gait Training, with a video case example of a 57 year old female 1 month post-stroke with L hemiparesis.

The discussion includes specific strategies for implementing the Locomotor Training <u>Clinical Practice Guideline</u> by focusing on subcomponents of gait, as well as limitations and caveats of the CPG and problem solving other measures of intensity to ensure patients are being adequately challenged.

This is a great example for clinicians and students hoping to provide High Intensity Gait Training in a clinical setting.
